Program Overview:

Global Grants and the "Unplugged Hub" in Nepal and India.

- a) This project provides training and computers outside Katmandu
- It addresses both literacy and sex trafficking and is intentionally placed in an area where sex trafficking is a large problem
- c) Most kids who are sold are sold by a relative due to financial hardship
- d) Nepal has a reverse dowery system (i.e. the bride's family pays). If the family has a lot of daughters, it will go into debt to provide doweries
- e) If the girl has an income, it changes everything
- f) This project uses a mini computer (the unplugged hub (UPH) that can be held in your hand, is battery operated, can link up to 50 computers and does not require WIFI
- g) Jan 1st the program started in Nepal, it targets girls age 10 to college age
- h) To launch this type of project requires: teachers, classroom space, 7 laptops and the UPH device and about \$12,500. There is no cost to the student
- i) \$3,000 is needed to complete covering the cost of the project now underway, his club is willing to partner
- j) They are looking to start another project in a more remote area

k) The empowerment of women is the key to development
